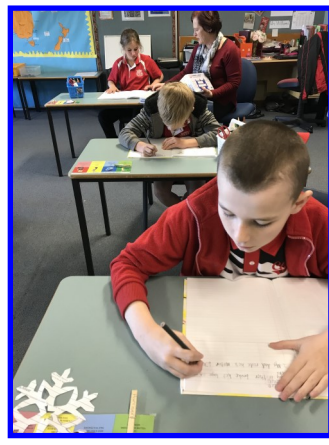


Teal student's are working hard
