In Week 8 the whole school participated in activities at the Murrook Culture Centre. Murrook's purpose is to gather, sustain, protect and teach Aboriginal Culture to all people with an emphasis on Worimi culture, being the land and people of that area. Fennell Bay students and staff shared in many facets of Aboriginal culture from communication such as art and dance, boomerang use and design, bush tucker, medicine and the Dreaming.

NAIDOC 2019 Voice Truth Treaty

Fennell Bay PS are proud educators and supporters of our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students and families. NAIDOC week is a key time where we learn, celebrate and come together as a community.

Our students performed well on stage, as we are proud of our heritage and they always shine when performing.

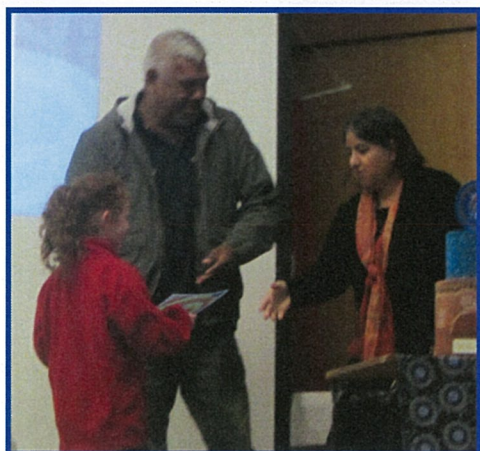
Thank you to Rebecca Gale on our wonderful cake, the children always enjoy your cake.

Deadly Streaming Group

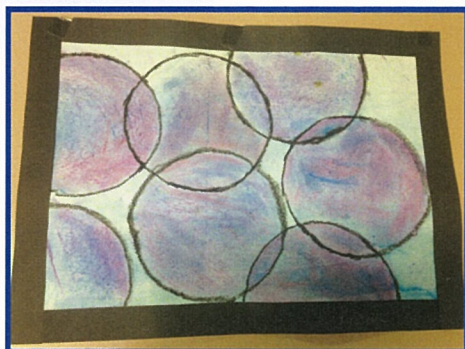

Ruby Narrative Writing in Term 3

Dear Families,

We are studying the elements of narrative writing in Term 3. To go along with this unit, our Speaking and Listening task (each Friday) will help support and reinforce our learning. Students of Ruby are asked to prepare a short story linked to a given weekly topic.

Students are:

- expected to prepare a short story to be presented orally for no more than one minute to a small group of peers (3-5 people).
- encouraged to use the topic stimulus of the week.
- to use an appropriate story structure (example: beginning, middle and end).
- able to use helpful and appropriate props (optional) – i.e. toys photos, written story, costumes etc.

What I'm looking for:

- addressing the weekly topic stimulus.
- speaking clearly with appropriate volume.
- maintaining a good story structure.
- maintaining eye contact.
- sticking to the time limit of no more than one minute.

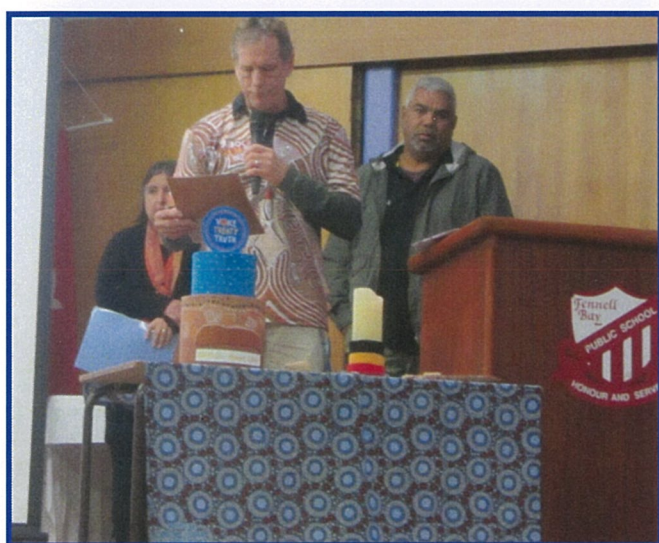
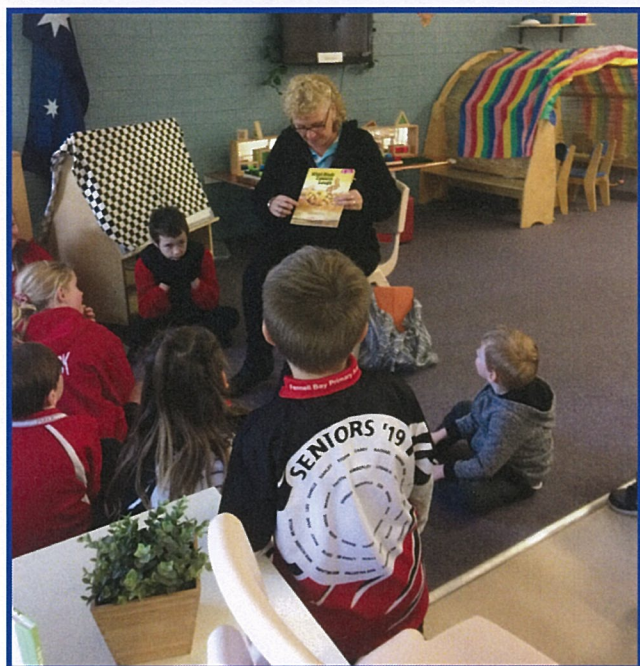
