Kiss and Ride Area



Please be aware that the school has a 'Kiss and Ride' area. This is located just past the entrance to the second carpark.

The 'Kiss and Ride" area provides parents/ caregivers a safe environment to drop off and collect students between the following times: 8-9.30am and 2-4pm. Parents and carers are able to legally drop off or pick up their children within a two minute timeframe.

This area is monitored by police and council and a fine will result if a vehicle remains in the area for a length of time.
